

Celebrate spreads its wings across Norfolk

Celebrate Norwich & Norfolk will be demonstrating the Christian church in action at three locations across the county in June.

elebrate Norwich & Norfolk will return to The Forum and Millennium Plain in Norwich city centre on Saturday June 11 with a free exhibition of over 25 Christian organisations, charities and churches, including OMF, Norwich Foodbank, Community Action Norwich, Christian Aid, Mothers Union, Christian Conference Trust, Christian Police Association, Spin Crazy, TLC, European Christian Mission, Heartbeat, Christians Against Poverty, Hope into Action, Norfolk Street Partnership and YMCA Norfolk.

There will also be a Leaders' Breakfast, a professional production of Amazing Grace, a combined churches choir, Messy Church activities and a youth programme from Norwich Youth For Christ. On Sunday June 12 there is a free picnic for volunteers to celebrate the Queen's 90th birthday and a celebration service at the Cathedral of St John the Baptist - see pages 2 to 5.

Celebrate will also take place in King's Lynn for the first time on June 11 with a free, fun-filled day for all of the family at The Walks, King's Lynn.

Various churches will gather to celebrate the town and its community and from 10am to 6pm there will be a wide variety of activities, games, sports and entertainment from the main stage including live music from rap and hip-hop artist Jelz, the Darn Funk Orchestra and the Bean Baker Band. The King's Lynn Patriots American football team will also be making an appearance.

The free event coincides with Queen Elizabeth's 90th

The free event coincides with Queen Elizabeth's 90th birthday and aims to fulfil her particular request to have churches join together in the celebrations – see page 6.

Celebrate will also be at this year's Royal Norfolk Show on June 29 and 30, where it is joining together with the Diocese of Norwich to put on an exhibition of the church in action across the region. The Diocese has doubled the usual size of its exhibition marquee and a whole host of Christian groups and organisations will come together under the Celebrate banner to join in.

Features will include Forest Church, a prayer space, cinema, toddler area, Messy Church, café and the Christian projects exhibition – see page 8.

John Newton - Amazing Grace is Saltmine theatre company's portrayal of the life story of the slave trader turned church leader and hymn writer. It has been enjoyed by audiences throughout the UK.

Press-ganged into the navy at 19, flogged for desertion and torn from the girl he loves, John Newton feels he has nothing to live for. Making his way into the harsh world of the eighteenth century transatlantic slave trade, he earns his living as an abusive trafficker of human flesh.

He is a man beyond redemption, making enemies of all he meets, on his way to hell. Then, one stormy night, with his ship going down, he faces certain death... and nothing is the same again. This is a powerfully moving story of slavery, freedom and the remarkable power of love and grace to transform a life.

hat an exciting year it's turning out to be. We are celebrating the growth and development of Celebrate Norwich and Norfolk. We have experienced growth in the team, with new people who are contributing their gifting and bringing inspiration to our work. Because of this we are breaking out in new ways.

In Norwich we shall begin the day on June 11 with a Leaders Breakfast and end it with a drama "Amazing Grace", the story of John Newton, two new ventures. The support of Rev Matthew Hutton and St Stephen's

The Celebrate Norwich and Norfolk Christian Services and Projects Exhibition will take place in the Forum and on Millennium Plain, Norwich from 10am to 5pm on Saturday June 11.

- Belsey Bridge Christian Conference Centre: located in Ditchingham on the Norfolk/ Suffolk border, the centre specialises in residential and day conferences for up to 110 delegates. Part of the Christian Conference Trust.
- OMF International: is a Christian mission agency that serves the church and seeks to bring the gospel to all the peoples of East Asia. It helps to place Christians to share the love of Christ with East Asians worldwide.
- Norwich Foodbank: A Christian crisis foodbank project to offer free emergency food parcels to needy families across Norwich.

- Community of All Hallows: An Anglican Religious Community offering a programme of retreats at two retreat centres in South Norfolk and Norwich.

free historical walk and talk about the Christian faith and churches in central Norwich is being offered as part of the Celebrate Norwich & Norfolk event


Author and historian Ted Doe will be leading the one-hour walk which starts outside The Forum at 11am on Saturday June 11 during the Celebrate

Ted said: "For much of its history Norwich was a commercial centre and the second city of England. It contained a high proportion of literate, thinking citizens, accustomed to taking responsibility for their various commercial enterprises and demanding also to take responsibility for all other areas of their lives. Hence, as we consider the religious history of our city, we see a kaleidoscope of ideas and practices.

"Our leisurely walk, starting at the Forum and lasting about one hour, will remind us of Rome and the Reformation, in both its mainstream and more radical manifestations; of monks and friars; of men and women who were prepared to die for their faith; and of the important role that women played in the life of the city.

"The story stretches from the Norman Conquest until the present day and gives us plenty to think

about. There is much to praise God for, alongside darker moments which we might want to forget but will be wise to remember.

For the past ten years Ted has given talks and led walks, on both Christian and secular themes, during the city's annual Heritage Weekends. He is the author of Who Do You Think You Are? a history of the Baptist Church in Norwich.

- Norfolk Healing Rooms: Exist to offer prayer for healing to anyone, free of charge and without an appointment, for physical, emotional or spiritual needs in accordance with
- The Matthew Project: Supporting people with drug and alcohol related issues, providing innovative education about the risks of drugs and alcohol, empowering people to make more informed choices.
- **■** Christian Police Association: aims to encourage and support Christians in the Police Service, and help them to communicate, in words and action, the truth, message and hope of the gospel of Jesus Christ to colleagues and the communities they serve and build bridges between the Christian community and the police.

nominational mission agency. ECM aims to plant churches in Europe currently through about 160 workers in 17 different countries. ECM always works together with existing churches.

- Spin Crazy: was founded by Samuel Goffe as part of his final major project at college, where he designed his first spin art machine. Today we travel to many different events taking our spin machines, armed with paint, allowing people of any age to have a go to express their inner creativity.
- ■TLC: is a Great Yarmouth-based team of Christians from different denominations with a heart to show the love of God in the community. They run a number of projects including 1-to-1 Family Support, Baskets and Banter, Christian Craft Nite, Knit or Natter, Life's a Puzzle, Street Evangelism Team, Street Presence Team.
- Heartbeat Ministries: is a Norfolk-based servant ministry that seeks to strengthen people to become healthy and active members within the Body of Christ. It has monthly meetings plus occasional conferences and events bringing in anointed men and women to minister to the wider region of East Anglia.
- Hope Into Action: Provides homes for the most vulnerable in society in partnership with local churches. It works with six churches in and around Norwich, providing homes for 14 people in five houses.

- **Eckling Grange:** A Christian Care Home and Sheltered Accommodation provider set in beautiful, well maintained grounds on the outskirts of Dereham in Mid-Norfolk. It offers four types of care within its six-acre complex.
- **Christians Against Poverty:** is a free debt counselling service, providing a holistic service that supports clients until they are released from the burden that debt brings. The service is available to all regardless of age, gender, background or belief. This nationally recognised charity is now partnering with a number of churches across Norfolk.
- Wycliffe Bible Translators: Wycliffe believe that the Bible is the best way for people to come to know and understand who God is. Its vision is that by working with churches, organisations and individuals from around the world all people will have access to God's word in a language that they truly understand.
- Norfolk Street Partnership: NSP runs street and prayer teams with the aim of providing a calming presence on the night-time streets of the clubland areas of Norwich city
- ■YMCA Norfolk: Works with disadvantaged young people and families in Norfolk who are at a point of crisis in their lives, including those who have been affected by homelessness, and support them towards a brighter future

There will also be fun sporting activities including a bouncy castle, sumo wrestling, The Eliminator, The Caterpillar for under-fives, and a giant inflatable slide





Queen says Jesus is her inspiration

People across Britain and the Commonwealth have been celebrating the life and service of the longest-serving British monarch – Queen Elizabeth II on the occasion of her 90th birthday and Celebrate Norfolk will be paying its own tribute on Sunday June 12.

national service of thanksgiving will be held at St Paul's Cathedral on Friday June 10; the traditional trooping the colour ceremony to mark the Queen's official birthday on Horse Guards Parade will take place on Saturday June 11; and a massive street party for 10,000 people will take place on The Mall on Sunday June 12.

A special book has also been brought out to commemorate the Queen's life, which has been devoted to her people, called **The Servant Queen - and the King she serves**.

The beautifully illustrated short book uses the Queen's own words to draw out the central role in her life of her trust in Jesus Christ.

In her 2014 Christmas broadcast, the Queen said: "For me, the life of Jesus Christ, the Prince of Peace, whose birth we celebrate today, is an inspiration and an anchor in my life. A role-model of reconciliation and forgiveness, he stretched out his hands in love, acceptance and healing. Christ's example has taught me to seek

to respect and value all people of whatever faith or none."

The book tells the story of a remarkable woman who became Queen at the age of 25 in February 1952, following the death of her father King George VI. She was crowned in June 1953 at Westminster Abbey.

During her 63 years on the throne she has be adviser and confidente to 12 British Prime Ministers, she is the most famous woman in the world and says that she prays every day.

Her strong faith in Christ does not lead her to exclude people of other faiths but rather to embrace them and to accord them the same respect and dignity she does to those who share her own beliefs.

So what is the secret to the Queen's extraordinary contribution to the nation and the Commonweath?

In 2002 she answered the question herself, saying: "I know just how much I rely on my faith to guide me through the good times and the bad. Each day is a new beginning. I know that the only way to live my life is to try to do what is right, to take the long view, to give of my best in all that the day brings and to put my trust in God. I draw strength from the message of hope in the Christian gospel."


